

## Fields of Study

The "Framework of the JDS Project" is characterized by several "Sub-programs" and "Components", which aims to deal and address selected target priority areas and development issues of the Philippines. The accepted participants are screened and selected in consideration of the relevance of their qualifications to the overall Framework as seen below.
